

LOCATION

The community is surrounded by the boreal forest — a picturesque landscape that is only 90 minutes away by air from major centres. So what are you waiting for? Are you in?

TRANSPORTATION

Airport

The Victor M. Power Airport is one of the largest in Northern Ontario. Timmins boasts two major airlines (Air Canada and Porter), as well as several regional air services. The airport offers multiple flights daily to Toronto, as well as other major markets in Northern Ontario and Quebec.

Timmins Transit provides safe and accessible transit throughout the city. For schedule information and additional services visit *timminstransit.ca*.






RECREATION & TOURISM

TOP 10 THINGS TO DO



If you like the outdoors, but "roughing it" isn't exactly your thing, then glamping is for you. Service providers can set you up with everything you'll need for your canoe, fishing or ATV trip, including: equipment, luxurious sleeping quarters, superb meals and professional guides. In the evening, you can listen to the loons as you relax on your queen-sized bed in the privacy of your own prospector's tent, or gaze at the stars as you sit around the campfire. For a traditional camping experience you can also check out Kettle Lakes and Ivanhoe Provincial Parks or private sector campgrounds.

Snowmobiling

Timmins has some of the best snowmobiling opportunities in the world. Over 440 km of groomed trails wind through forests and deep powder meadows, connecting you to a larger trail network of 30,000 km! In a city renowned for being snowmobile-friendly, you can sled right up to hotels, restaurants, gas stations and shops. Trails are open from December to March.

Nordic Bath & Wilderness Park

You can heat things up in a sauna or steam bath and soak it up in a saltwater pool, Nordic waterfall or whirlpool. You can also meet the majestic Canadian moose, feed an elk and watch a bison graze at a wilderness preserve.

Downhill Skiing, Snowboarding and Tubing

Spend the day on the groomed slopes of Kamiskotia Snow Resort. The resort has 12 runs for downhill skiing, snowboarding and a snow tube park. After an exhilarating day in the crisp outdoors, warm up and chat with new friends in the chalet.

Golfing

Discover two 18 hole championship courses and a challenging 9 hole course in the centre of the boreal forest. Tee off at the Hollinger Golf Club, Spruce Needles Golf Club or the Sandy Falls Golf Course.

Dog Sledding

Bundle up and get whisked away on a sled through some of the most scenic woodland trails in Canada. There are adventures for all age groups and experience levels.

Canoeing, Kayaking, Hiking and Biking

Rent a canoe, kayak or bike and take advantage of the city's location near the boreal forest. Choose one of many routes that will lead you to majestic views of lakes, waterfalls and geological formations. Hersey Lake has one of the most extensive trail networks to explore.

Cross-country Skiing and Snowshoeing

Glide over 30 km of groomed trails at the Porcupine Ski Runners' multi-million dollar complex. Take advantage of the opportunity to share the great outdoors with lynx, moose, weasels, snow hares, partridges and snowy owls!

Fishing

You can fish in some of the 500 lakes, rivers and streams within city limits. Set your hook for Great Northern Pike, Perch, Small Mouth Bass, Trout, Walleye and Whitefish. Troll the mighty Mattagami River or Kenogamissi Lake, or try your hand at ice fishing.

LIFESTYLE

You're looking for a city that provides you with the right mix of culture, activities and amenities.You want to experience a unique cultural environment or perhaps you're looking for a city that supports the arts. If you can imagine yourself in this kind of city, then Timmins is for you.

Culture

First Nation, Métis and individuals from countries around the world (including but not limited to India, Nigeria and the Philippines) choose to make their home in Timmins. You'll be able to share in their traditions, cuisine and history. The annual Multicultural Festival and National Aboriginal Day are community favourites. In addition, Le Centre culturel La Ronde is a local hotspot for Francophone arts, crafts, culture and cuisine.

Music

Timmins will be music to your ears with its symphony orchestra and chorus performances, local musical talent and community events. Every summer, the annual Concert Series in Hollinger Park features a variety of genres of music from blues, rock and country to jazz, swing and French pop. The community has a host of seasoned instructors who can teach you a new instrument or simply advance you from singing in the shower.





Theatre

Do you have a flair for the dramatic? Then you'll probably want to get involved with at least one of Timmins' community theatre groups. Curtain Call, Take Two Theatre and Les maringouins du Nord produce original plays and comedy acts, and often host dinner theatre events.

Festivals

There are all kinds of reasons to get together and celebrate all year round: The Great Canadian Kayak Challenge & Festival, Ribfest, South Porcupine Summerfest, Winter Carnival, Fall Fair and Schumacher Days just to name a few.

Museum and Arts

You'll enjoy the programming, activities and workshops offered by the Timmins Museum. It regularly features special exhibits, as it is one of twenty-three National Exhibition Centres in Canada. Past exhibits have included works from the McMichael Canadian Collection, the Royal Ontario Museum and the Art Gallery of Ontario.

Libraries

Timmins' two public libraries are great to visit if you like learning new things and meeting others with similar interests. You can join writing, photography and book clubs, or attend special events such as artist talks, author readings and children's events.



DOWNTOWN & SHOPPING

Do you love to shop 'til you drop? Timmins has big box stores and unique boutiques.

Big Box Stores & Shopping Centres

At the west end of Timmins you'll find large retail outlets such as Canadian Tire, Home Depot, Future Shop, Wal-Mart, Home Hardware and Mark's. The Timmins Square, one of the largest shopping malls in Northeastern Ontario, is home to over 70 shops and services, including popular fashion, home furnishings and electronics stores.

Timmins has not just one downtown, but three: one in Timmins' City Centre and one in each of the hamlets of South Porcupine and Schumacher. Take a stroll through Timmins' City Centre and visit a selection of over 250 businesses including cafés, restaurants, clothing boutiques, unique giftware, fine furniture, and a host of other consumer goods. Major financial institutions, insurance companies, government buildings, and professional organizations are also located in the City Centre.

In the summer months, the area becomes an Urban Park filled with great music, sidewalk stalls, fabulous food and a Farmers' Market.

Primary and Secondary Education

TADH is also a teaching facility and has strong ties to the Northern Ontario School of Medicine.
